

# Canberra's Camps 1928

## CANBERRA CAMPS 1928

Camps for single construction workers were established near to worksites and out of sight of permanent Canberra. In 1925 three semi-permanent camps were constructed - on the north side White City (now covered with School of Music building), centre on Capital Hill and on the south side of the Molonglo River near the railway station Causeway. At Westlake (Stirling Park) three commonwealth single men's camps were established - No 3 Sewer Camp (1922-1925), Old Tradesmen's Camp (1923 - 1927) and No 1 Labourers' Camp (1924 - 1927). Contractor John Howie had already built his Hostel Camp in 1922. It was removed between May and July 1927. The Burns Club was founded in their Mess Room in 1924. Howie also built timber cottages for his married men.

## CAPITOL HILL

This camp was built by Contractor John Howie in 1925. Note the spelling of capitOl. In the 1940s it was changed to capitAl. Around 1947 the camp was enlarged to take the new arrivals from overseas. In December 1928 Mrs Stanley became the Mess Caterer and stayed there until the men out of work could no longer afford to pay her and she in turn could not pay her rent to the Commonwealth.



The group of buildings on the right hand side above the middle line is Capitol Hill Camp around 1929. The buildings in the foreground area are part of Forrest. Today the site of Capitol Hill Camp is covered with the building of Parliament House. In the middle top section of the page would be the area of Glebe Park and the building top left is Albert Hall. The road in front of it is Commonwealth Avenue. The map below shows the site of Capital Hill Hostel in the early 1950s. It was built to the right of the old camp. Also shown on this map is Hillside Hostel built in early 1950s.

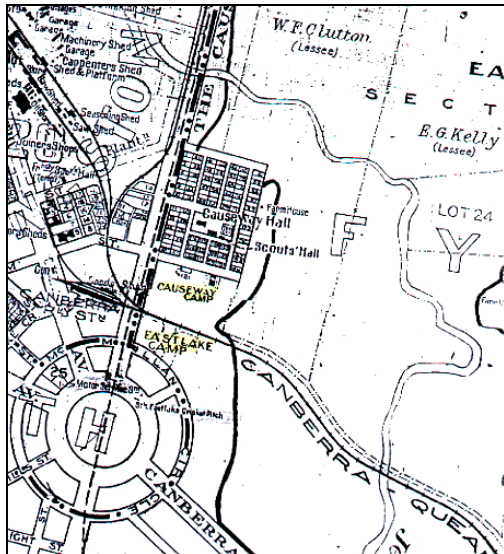

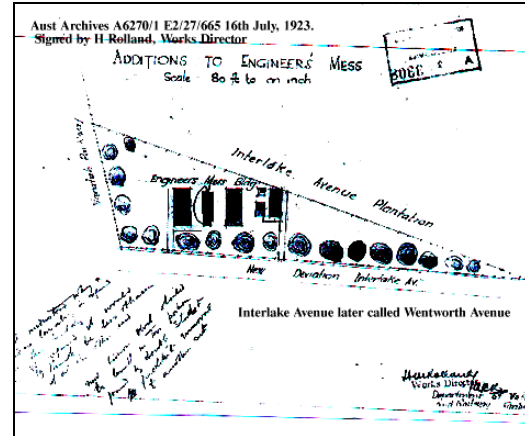
## EASTLAKE CAMP.

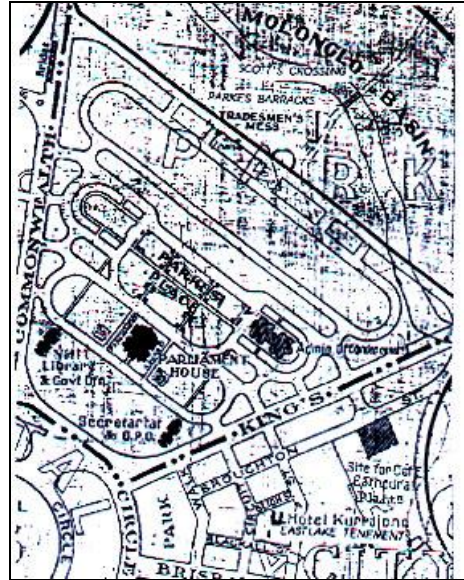

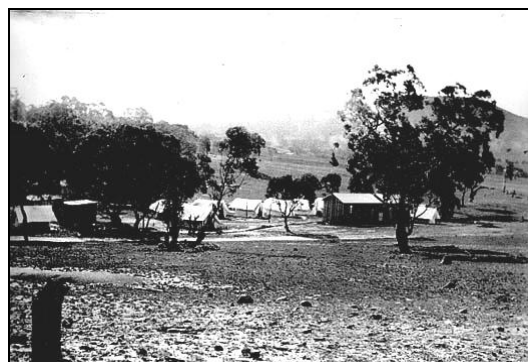

Below: Tradesmen's Camp at Westlake May 1927. It is in the background behind the Police Camp. The track coming down the hill on the righthand side of the photograph and the road across the hill are still in situ on the hillside now opposite Lotus Bay, Yarralumla.

Just out of sight of this photograph is a ditch that runs diagonally from the area of tent to the Hotel Canberra end. It too is still clearly visible. the timber building on right hand side in background may be a Mess Hall.

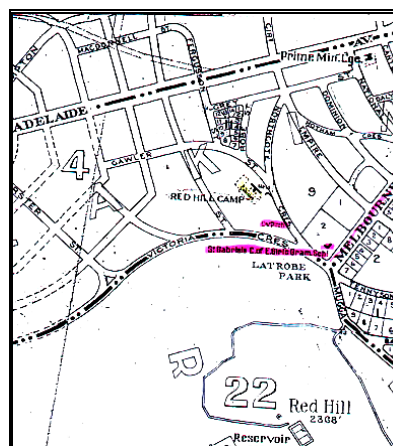


## RED HILL

Not on the electoral roll is William Norman Madden who was born on 17th May, 1892 and died on 17th May, 1928. He was 35 years of age and lived at Red Hill Camp. ### WHITE CITY CAMP.

---

This camp was built in 1925 on the site now part of the School of Music near Civic. It was named after the white canvas of the tents. In 1926/1927 the tents were replaced by cubicles painted green. Removed around 1931. Bill Mitchell was their last Mess Caterer and like Mrs Stanley also went broke. Bill Convine of Molonglo was the first Mess Caterer.
