

Molonglo 1928

Molonglo was the *four mile* – that is it was situated four miles from Queanbeyan Post Office. It is now Fyshwick - the industrial centre of Canberra. Molonglo Internment Camp was built in 1918. In 1921/1922 the unsold barracks were converted into 120 cottages & a Tradesmen's barrack. During the time of the Internment Camp there were a number of deaths. They included Ellen Rohmann aged 35 who died on 30th November, 1918. Her body was buried at Riverside Cemetery Queanbeyan. After the war it was exhumed and taken to Melbourne where it was reburied. The cook at Molonglo Internment Camp in 1918, Gwilym Ewarth (Bill) Samuel died 4th September 1964 and is buried at Riverside.

Two other burials at Riverside are the daughters of James Francis and Sarah Ellen Staples. Muriel Ellen born at Molonglo 13th April 1923 died 7th February, 1924 and Kathleen May born 24th June 1925 died 7th October, 1925. Another burial in the Riverside list is that of Joyce O'Reilly of Molonglo - died 9th March 1924 aged 11 months.

St John's Church Cemetery contains the body of Phyllis daughter of John and Myrtle Heckenberg. John was a carpenter and the family lived at Molonglo at the time of their daughter's death 29th March 1926. Another child buried at St John's is baby Cavanagh, child of Ernest James Cavanagh and his wife Sybil Anne who were living at Molonglo at the time of the birth of their still born child on 12th June, 1926. The family later moved to Causeway where their 7 year old son, Kenneth John died on 15th December, 1930.

Dennis Grannal, son of Francis and Cecilia Grannal of Molonglo was born 10th August 1926 and died 6th February 1927. He is buried at St John the Baptist Church Cemetery.

The baby son of Sidney John Bell and his wife Charlotte who lived for only three hours on 27th January 1930. The family then lived at 74 Molonglo. Later the Bell family moved to 39 Westlake. The baby is buried at St John the Baptist Church Cemetery.

Darrell Arthur Freeland aged 9 months died 24th March 1930. His family lived at 88 Molonglo and his parents were Arthur and Jessie Freeland.

Several O'Reilly children are buried at St John the Baptist Churchyard. They include: Mavis Mary O'Reilly, fifth child of John Everard and Maud (nee Hammond). She died 7th September 1928. By the time her brother Keith died 16th July, 1935 the family had moved to Causeway. Maud O'Reilly died 11th July 1975 aged 79 and John Everard O'Reilly 9th December 1985 aged 90 years. The family came to Canberra in 1926.

Jane Haslam and her son Robert Colin are buried at St John's. Jane died 8th January 1928 aged 45 years. She was the mother of seven children and was nee McLeod. Robert Colin died 23rd February 1932 when

the wheel of a bus ran over him. He was eleven years of age and born at Duntroon in 1920. John Thomas Haslam was living at 15 Leichhardt Street at the time of his death 18th November 1945 and was 73 years of age.

William Edward Cope of No 1 Molonglo died 29th June 1932 aged 32. His wife was Thelma Valerie and the couple had two children. Buried St Johns.

Frederick Desmond Lawler labourer of Molonglo was aged 26 years old at the time of his death 1st November, 1932. He is buried at St John's.

Frederick Miles, son of Henrietta and Arthur was a labourer living at 8 Molonglo at the time of his death 3rd November 1932 - aged 27 years. His mother lived at 95 Causeway at the time of her death 1st November, 1943 aged 70 years. She had two sons and was the daughter of Henry and Rebecca Boyd. She was born in 1873 in NSW. Both mother and son are buried at St John's.

David Thomas Ramsay son of David and Emma (nee Lane) Ramsay was born at Guilford Victoria in 1876. He married Mabel. He died at Molonglo Settlement 17th August 1934 aged 58 years. He is buried at St John's.

Thomas McDiarmid an electrician living at 36 Molonglo died 9th September 1934. His wife was named Olga and he was the father of two children. He is buried at St John's.

Walter Anderson, son of Archibald and Emily (nee Wilson) died at Molonglo 21st August, 1936 aged 51 years. He is buried at St John's with his brother, Archibald who died at Duntroon aged 15 years on 15th March 1910. Their mother, Emily is also buried at St John's. She married Archibald Anderson, a coachman, in 1882. She was born at Carwoola. She died at Bungendore 28th May, 1927 aged 61. Archibald died 17th October 1931 aged 75 and another son, John Harvie died 4th December 1918 aged 20 years. They are all at St John's.

Harold Blewitt, fourth child of Ernest Edward and Mary Margaret Blewitt of 28 Molonglo died 25th November 1935 aged 4 years. He is buried at St John's. Reference *St John's Churchyard* by Jean Salisbury.

Bernardo Antonio (Tony) Radin arrived in Australia in 1922 from Schio Italy. He worked in Corrimal as a coal miner before coming to Canberra where he worked on Parliament House. He was responsible for installing the Coat of Arms above the Speaker's chair. For a time he lived in one of the single men's camps [probably White City]. In 1925 his wife Edvige arrived with two of their three sons. The son left behind came to Australia a year later. The family moved into Molonglo where they stayed until they

moved back to Sydney. The boys were Guiseppe (eldest), Luigi (second son - left behind and came later) and Carlo - born in 1918.

John Haisley Angus died 24th March 1974 and was buried at Woden Cemetery. In the next grave is Susanna Angus who died on 1st July, 1973.

Later moved to 50 Westlake. Part of the story of the Bellchamber's family is found in the 1943 Electoral Roll for Westlake. Annie Fullerton Bellchambers was buried in Woden Cemetery on 23rd June, 1965. Claude Leslie Bellchambers is in the next grave and was buried on 19th April, 1960. Their son Roy Jeffrey Bellchambers is also buried at Woden. He was buried on 31st October 1975.

Alfred William Bennett was buried in Woden Cemetery on 3rd December, 1950.

Emily Jane Bland was buried in Woden Cemetery on 14th February 1959. Also in the cemetery list is Alfred Henry Bland who was buried at Woden Cemetery on 25th September 1946.

52 BLEWITT, Frances & Joseph hd & labourer
Later moved to 13 Westlake. Both are buried in the Woden Cemetery. Frances Elizabeth died on 3rd March, 1976 and Joseph on 14th November, 1971. Lawrence Blewitt was buried at Woden on 24th December 1962 and Ray (Roy?) Joseph was buried on 4th November, 1969 in the ex-servicemen's section.

BOURKE, Alice, Charles & Hilton hd, miner & labourer
Alice Maude Bourke was buried in the RC Section of Woden Cemetery on 27th January, 1956. In the same grave is Charles Bourke who was buried on 30th July 1949. His grave was paid by Cavan Madden Lalor of 75 Ebdon Street Ainslie. Charles Richard Bourke died on 29th July 1949 aged 79 years. His address was the same as Cavan Lalor.

Alice Edith Elliott, daughter of Robert and Jane (nee Ingram) Elliott married Raymond Francis Brown and had nine children - four baptised at St John's between 1925 and 1931. She died on 20th July 1980 aged 83 years. The family later moved to 118 Causeway. Raymond Francis Brown died 13th April 1938 aged 41. He had served as a sapper in World War 1. Both are buried in St John the Baptist Church Cemetery along with two of their children - Joyce Moya baptised at St John's 1925 and was 13 months old when she died 15th June 1926 - Harold Leslie died 12th November 1929 aged 17 months. March 1973 and is buried in the ex-servicemen's section. 11 Bentham Street was sold after Phillip Dixon's death and was pulled down in 2001. A new house is now on the site.

William Convine (father) was Mess Caterer at White City Camp and later the family moved to Queanbeyan and then 44 Westlake.

Alice Maud Convine died on 14th October 1956 aged 55 years. She is buried in Woden Cemetery and the grave was paid by William Isaac Convine. At the time of her death the family lived at 12 Baker Gardens. On the 25th August 1941 Mrs Convine then living in Henderson Road Queanbeyan paid for the grave in the Anglican Section of Woden Cemetery of Mary Ellen Worster who died on 24th August 1941 aged 64. Her address was given as c/o Cleaver's Newsagency Kingston.

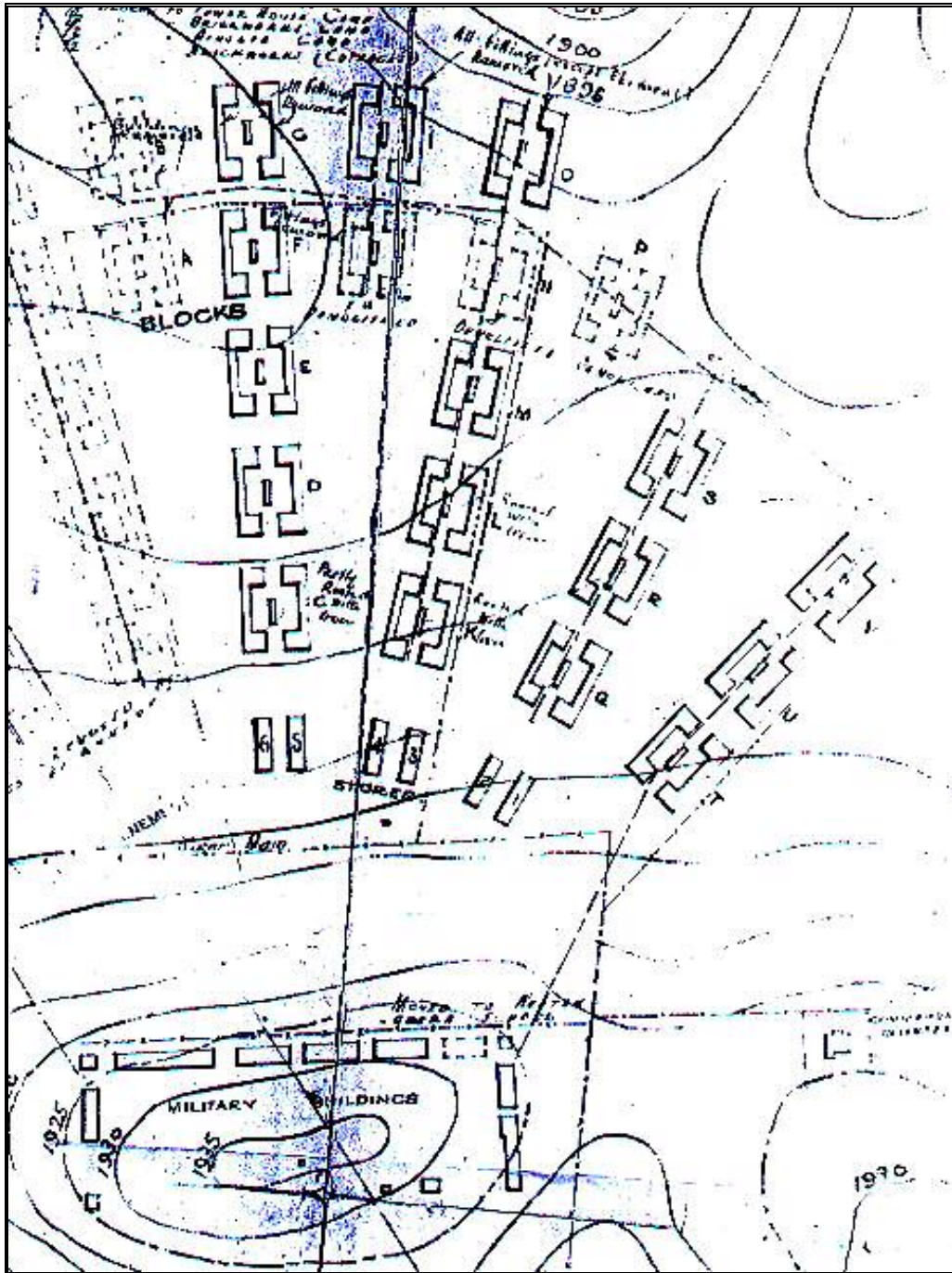

Molonglo Internment Camp in the period 1920-21 had half the barracks sold. The remaining ones were moved to new sites around Canberra and converted into dwellings for married construction workers and accommodation for 150 single tradesmen. The barracks were in 1927 separated to form cottages. At that time a bathroom was included in each dwelling. Prior to that the families shared the bathroom, laundry areas that were in the centre of each of the barrack complexes. There were insufficient coppers for the number of people using them that led to many problems. Bath water had also to be heated in the coppers and carried by buckets up three steps into the bathroom where it was deposited after numerous trips in the tin baths provided.
