AINSLIE 1928.

This suburb was originally divided into Ainslie, North Ainslie & South Ainslie. Later renamed into Braddon, Ainslie and Reid. The minimum covenant of a house brick cottage in Ainslie was 700 pounds. House numbers did not come into use until later. There are a number of stories about furniture being delivered to the wrong houses. The majority of cottages were built in 1926 in readiness for the public servants transferring to the ACT. In 1921-1922 a small number of small brick cottages were built in Neighbourhood No 1. This area was bounded by Donaldson, Elimatta, Batman and Currong Streets and was divided in two by Doonkuna Street. Below: Photograph taken circa 1927. The road on the right is Doonkuna Street and the cottage at the end is still in situ. The tennis court went some years ago. There is no sign of it today. Below is a photograph of the court. The FCC11 cottage still stands with at time of writing no additions to the façade of the cottage.

Letitia Alice Ware died on 25th May 1983 and was buried in Woden Cemetery. In the same grave is William John Ware who was buried on 12th April 1965. Bruce Ware of Acton gave a story for *True Tales From Canberra's Vanished Suburbs of Westlake, Westridge and Acton*. Part of this information follows: Bruce was born in September 1937. Sometime prior to his birth the family moved from Ainslie to 14 Acton Cottages. Two brother, Albert and William Ware came from Leeton and arrived in the territory in 1927. Bill (William) and his wife, Letitia (nee Ryan) were Bruce's parents. In Acton the next door cottage was tenanted by his Uncle Albert and his wife Kathleen. Bruce's father worked for a time in the government section - Water & Sewerage - and worked on the pipe line from the Cotter River to Red Hill. Bill and Ron were keen golfers and Bill was one of the men who helped to build the Federal Golf Club at Red Hill. Bruce and his wife still live in Canberra (2001).

Isabella died on 20th September, 1961. She was born on 5th June, 1875. Isabel - daughter of Frank and Isabella married in 1924 to Thomas William Hamilton Dee. She died on 30th September 1989 aged 86. CORROBOREE PARK, AINSLIE

The weatherboard cottages constructed for artisans were built in this area. The current Ainslie Hall in the park was moved there in the 1930/31 Financial Year. It started out as the Masonic Lodge erected at Acton by Contractor John Howie. In 1927 it was moved to Russell Hill where it was converted into a school - opened in September, 1927 by Charles Daley. The name of the park came from the oral tradition that this site was used by the Ngunawal people as a corroboree place. In the late 1920s a monumental fountain with suitable inscription was designed for the park to note its original purpose. It was never built probably because the Great Depression meant that money was not available.

Competition in the 1920s...*"The placid village of Tuggranong has been aroused from slumber by a spirited young candidate..." Thus began Miss Margaret Morrison's column, and it went on "that 'Maggie' knows how to ride a winner, her many celebrated victories as an equestrian amply testify...with her vigorous personality in which a winsome girlish charm is happily blended with the cavalier spirit of dashing Australian horsewoman, she is sure to demand attention when the whips begin to crack and the hoofs start their thunder." Miss Morrison who later on married Mr LD Lyons, was well known in those days, and for years after for her participation in fund raising activities. She like all the Morrisons of Tralee played outstanding parts. The tunnellers out Westridge way in the early twenties knew Maggie Morrison and her trusty steed. She drove over from Tralee on pay-days to gather a few pounds each week from the sewer diggers. There was a great shat at the main tunnel entrance not far from the Prime Minister's Lodge. It went down forty-five feet to the tunnels below, and Miss Morrison went down in the bucket to tramp the lengthy passages and collect the donations from the men. In his practical way Father Haydon often referred to these long corridors underground as "the Catacombs of Canberra." The men had great respect for the young damsel who showed such daring and they looked forward to her weekly visit. Kindly tunnel supervisor, Jerry Dillon, chaperoned the young lady and with Irish of his father inspiring him, he encouraged his men to be mindful of the "Faith of their Fathers" and to dig deep into their pockets. Miss Morrison was a constant visitor to the site of Parliament House - and for Father Haydon's parish debt, and it is told that one day in an inspired moment she urged her horse to descend into the great trenches made for the foundations of "The House". For goodly distances, mount and rider enjoyed a brief adventure that was unique and in a sense of some historical significance....*

Elsie Julia Tilley died on 4th January 1936 and is the first person to be buried in the Woden Cemetery. she was aged 35 years at the time of her death and her tombstone states that she was the wife of Edward and mother of Peter, Christopher and Mary. By the time of the 1935 Electoral Roll the family had moved to Torrens Street Braddon. Another roll in the 1940s have the name Gertrude - home duties - that suggests that Edward may have remarried. He is not on the 1949 Electoral Roll. Alexander J McGilvray *Hallowed High Adventure* reference is made to the Tilley family. In August 1927 Mr Ted Tilley an officer of the Prime Minister's Department, came to Canberra from Melbourne and lived at Ainslie, a sparse suburb in those days. Mr LD Lyons, well-known in Canberra for over forty-five years lived at Ted Tilley's place until his marriage in 1929. Mrs Tilley died in 1936 at the age of 35. She was formerly Miss Elsie Pearce of Coburg. Three children, the eldest only five, were left to mourn her. Mention is made here of her death as her funeral was the first to leave St Patrick's Church School, and hers was the first Catholic burial in Canberra's Cemetery. The following is from the Obituary Notice in the *Canberra Times* of January 6th, 1936: *...Noticed amongst the mourners were the office-bearers of the Hibernian Friendly Society. The prayers at the graveside were recited by Father Haydon, assisted by Fathers J Twomey and E Barry. At the conclusion of the prescribed prayers Father Haydon said although funeral orations at the graveside were against the custom of the Church, an exception might be made on the occasion of the first internment in the Canberra Cemetery, which was that of a model wife and mother, whose death they all felt keenly...* Father Haydon is buried nearby. He died on the 19th April, 1949 at the age of 59. By the time of his death he was Monsignor Haydon and a man much loved by all. He was an old friend of Archdeacon Robertson of St John's at Reid.

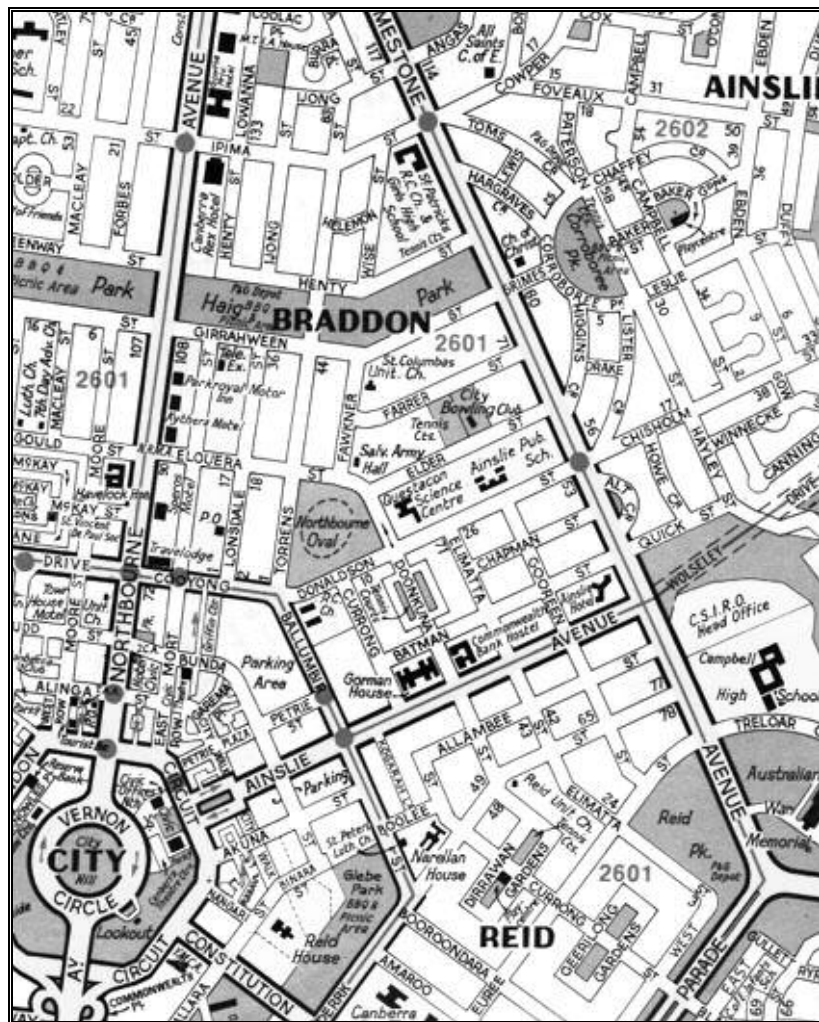
